



Car Parking Benefit

This benefit allows you to salary package the cost of a car park, in respect of your employment. The car park must be in an approved parking facility, owned or leased by your employer, and provided to you, at or near your place of work.

By packaging the cost of car parking, you could pay for the incurred costs and any related Fringe Benefits Tax (FBT) using your pre-tax salary, thereby reducing your taxable income and potentially saving you on income tax as car parking benefits are generally taxed concessional for FBT purposes.

Additionally, you could save the GST on your parking costs because input tax credits for the GST portion may be claimable by your employer.

Note: It is also possible to package some of the cost using post-tax salary contributions to mitigate the FBT taxable value of the car parking benefit.

Program Conditions:

Salary packaging of car parking is subject to strict and often complex ATO rules.
